In addition, I will be proud to be one of the best product learners from Mpangua Primary School in days to come. I promise to be the best and the most obedient student. I will work hard in my studies to achieve my goals in education

Our three secondary school graduates are now on to their pursuit of higher education, thanks to the continuing support of their sponsors. Kelvin is pursuing a degree in teaching, Dennis in Film and Video Production, Pamela in Fashion Design (tailoring), and Festus in Mechanics and Driving School. None of these students would have advanced this far without the sponsorship of the Presbytery of the Northern

Plains scholarship fund. Thank you so much to those who have contributed and to the Bill and Carolyn Hunter Scholarship Fund.

The parents of Mpangua Primary School shared that they are continuing collecting money from each family in order to pay for the survey for the laying of the water pipes. They hope to have the money soon and once the survey is complete, they will begin the digging of the ditch for the pipes. It will be a great day when this project is finished. The mothers are especially anxious for it as they fear for their children's safety as they walk to and from the river each day to fetch water for the school.

The parents have also raised the funds to purchase a printer for the school. This is a great addition for the teachers and the parents are very proud.

The biggest problem facing the school continues to be hunger. We are so grateful for those in the Presbytery who have donated to the hunger fund. The amount needed to subsidize the lunch program for Term 1 is \$1237. This is for 188 students and the 10 teachers. The CPMT has sent \$1500 for Term one. The Headmaster will send the budget for Term 2 before we send the next installment. THANK YOU to everyone who has contributed to this fund. In addition to feeding the school children of Mpangua, the money has been used to provide desperately hungry families within each Presbytery.

At the end of the visit, Sharon was able to attend the teacher appreciation luncheon held by the Chogoria Partnership Board. This was made possible because of a donation by a member of the PNP! It was wonderful to take time to appreciate these dedicated teachers who do so much with so little. They really enjoyed going out for lunch in the nearby village. Our partners also presented them with a globe and each one received a thank you of 1000 KSH which is slightly less than \$10. The great news is that the academic test scores for this first Term are showing improvement over last year. Each step forward is worth celebrating!

The International Kenya Mission Partnership meetings in Nairobi were attended by mission personnel and partners from Ireland, the US and Kenya. It was a time to gather together to share visions of cross-cultural partnerships and mission work and to hear reports from those in the mission field. It was two days of recognizing with great thanksgiving God's work in the world. Sharon was interviewed by Rev.
